As you know, the April meeting is the first nominations for officers and directors for the ensuing term beginning in July. The Nominating Committee will present its report followed by any nominations from the floor.

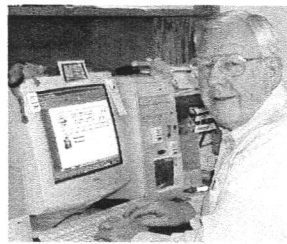

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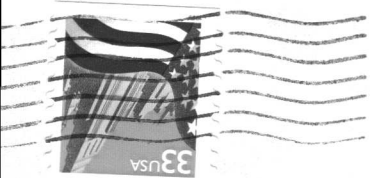
