IFA HISTORY ... LESSON #1

The California Division of the International Association of Identification was holding a convention in Fresno, CA on May 9, 10, and 11, 1929, and the host of the convention was William F. Jones, Sheriff of Fresno County.

A number of men from the San Francisco Bay District, who were members of the California Division, attended the convention. Among them were:

W. E. Schoppe, Superintendent, National Automobile Theft Bureau, San Francisco

C. M. Christiansen, U.S. Postal Inspector, San Francisco Robert H. Morse, U.S. Postal Inspector, San Francisco Philip E. Geauque, U.S. Secret Service, San Francisco

When these men arrived in Fresno and conferred with Sheriff Bill Jones, it developed that he had made no arrangements to entertain the visitors, who were from all parts of the country. The first thing agreed upon was to have an Open House, and two rooms in the Hotel Fresno were rented for that purpose. There were two vaudeville theaters in Fresno at that time and the managers were contacted and they agreed to send several acts each to the banquet for

entertainment, which was held on Saturday evening, May 11, 1929, in the Hotel Fresno.

Cooperating with the Bay District men were several from Fresno and elsewhere; some of them were:

Sheriff William F. Jones, Fresno County, CA Gerry F. Potts, National Automobile Theft Bureau, Fresno, CA Sheriff William "Dusty" Rhodes, Madera County, CA Chief Bill Walker, Fresno PD Superintendent Clarence F. Morrill, California State Bureau of Identification, Sacramento, CA

There were also several others whose names have been forgotten and they did not continue on to become members of the organization.

It was during the banquet, while Bob Morse and Phil Geauque were listening to musical numbers being played by Chief Walker, Gerry Potts and other Fresno police officers, that Bob Morse said to Geauque, "We should start an association and call it the 'International Footprint Association.' "Geauque inquired of Morse how he had such an idea and Morse replied, "Because we did such a good job of entertaining at this convention and the Footprinters would represent the fun or entertaining part of the organization." Geauque asked Morse if he was serious and Morse said he was. Geauque said, "Let's talk it over when we get home." Morse then said, "It is founded as of tonight," and Geauque agreed.

That evening the news spread rapidly regarding a new organization called the "International Footprint Association," and nearly everyone there present said they would join. However, nothing was done until Geauque drew a cartoon of the convention with the heading "International Footprint Association, Fresno, 1929." The cartoon was reproduced by the Bureau of Identification in the Sheriff's Office at Fresno in large quantities and it was circulated extensively among many law enforcement officers.
