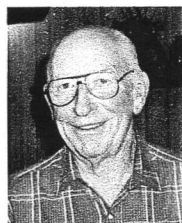

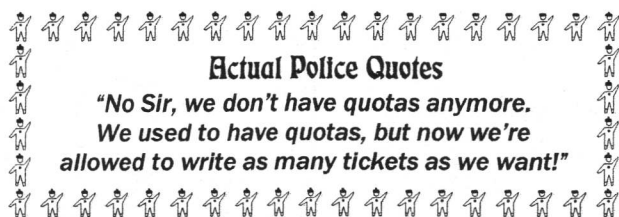
From The Vice-President

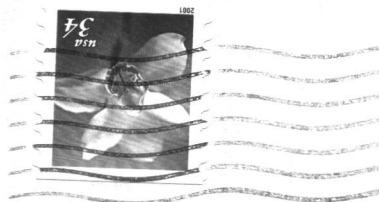
