From the Secy/Treas.

For those of you who know former Grand Secretary-Treasurer Carl Johnson, I have just received information that he is recovering from a broken vertebra. Carl would love to hear from his many Footprinter friends; calling or writing would definitely lift his spirits.

At the last meeting, the membership approved the following donations as recommended by your Board of Directors:

\$1000 for the Douglas County Sheriff's Search and Rescue. They have an ongoing need for new and replacement equipment which the county does not fund.

\$500 for the Douglas County Sheriff's Citizen's Patrol. This is the expanded program which started as the Handicap Parking Enforcement Program. It now handles vacation checks, abandoned vehicle reports, graffiti problems, placement of the DCSO radar trailer, etc., as well as handicap parking enforcement.

\$500 for the Douglas County Sheriff's Canine Program. DCSO has recently replaced a retired dog; another is slated for retirement soon. Certain canine training is funded by the county, but other expenses have to be paid by communitygenerated donations.

\$500 for the County TRIAD Program. TRIAD puts on the Senior Law Enforcement Academy and advances a number of causes for seniors in the county. They have a real need for additional funding.

The new slate of officers and directors as mentioned in Clay's column will take over for the year beginning July 1, 2002.

Sometime in May, I will be sending out a Dues Notice for the year beginning July 1, 2002. Yes, it is that time of year again!!! As usual, I would appreciate your renewing your membership sometime prior to July 1. It makes my bookkeeping somewhat easier. See you at the meeting.




