

About the Christmas party...

As a lot of you experienced during the afternoon on Saturday 12/14/02, a hurricane went through our area and played havoc with us. We lost a significant amount of shingles from our roof; in some places, the tar paper is gone leaving the bare roof sheathing to the weather. We also lost the roofing material from quite a few of our barns. A piece of roofing sailed through one of our garage windows spraying everything with small pieces of glass. One of our next door neighbor's barns (approx 8' deep, 16' wide, and maybe 4 or 5' tall), which was not anchored down, was picked up by the wind and carried through the cyclone fence between our yards, hitting the top of our horse trailer, moving down one of our interior fences, and came to rest on its top in our back yard!!!!! With the power outage from approx 4:00 PM until almost 11:00 PM on Saturday night, and the water pouring in the leaky window in the room where most of the serious activity (bar) was to occur on Sunday, there just wasn't any way we could go forward with the party. We called our president, Grady Goodwin, and explained the situation to him. He and those he recruited to help him, began calling the membership to advise them of the cancellation.

We've been doing this Christmas party for many, many years, and have thoroughly enjoyed the camaraderie that this event is all about.

How hard was the wind blowing here? We've heard from the high 80s to the high 90s to even the low 100s miles per hour. We heard from the Nevada Highway Patrol that in some areas the velocity qualified as a level 4 hurricane (131-155 MPH). The wind in a level 1 hurricane blows at 74-95 MPH, level 2 is 96-110 MPH, and level 3 is 111-130 MPH. We were certainly a solid level 1 at the very least.

This was enough excitement for a lifetime for this SF Bay Area person!!!!!

Hi Yanks,

I thought you all would like to see the real figures from Down Under. It has now been 12 months since gun owners in Australia were forced by a new law to surrender 640,381 personal firearms to be destroyed by our own government, a program costing Australian taxpayers more than \$500 million dollars.

The first year results are now in. Australiawide, homicides are up 3.2 percent; Australiawide, assaults are up 8.6 percent; Australiawide, armed robberies are up 44 percent (yes, 44 percent)! In the state of Victoria alone, homicides with firearms are now up 300 percent. (Note that while the law-abiding citizens turned them in, the criminals did not and criminals still possess their guns!) While figures over the previous 25 years showed a

steady decrease in armed robbery with firearms, this has changed drastically upward in the past 12 months, since the criminals now are guaranteed that their prey is unarmed. There has also been a dramatic increase in break-ins and assaults of the elderly. Australian politicians are at a loss to explain how public safety has decreased, after such monumental effort and expense was expended in "successfully ridding Australian society of guns." You won't see this data on the American evening news or hear your governor or members of the state Assembly disseminating this information.

The Australian experience proves it. Guns in the hands of honest citizens save lives and property and yes, gun-control laws affect only the law-abiding citizens. Take note Americans, before it's too late!
