

From the Vice-President


Another month has passed and all of you fellow Footprinters have outdone yourselves. We exceeded our all time high at our last meeting. Congratulations to everyone who attended.

Thanks to Dennis Johnson and Jay Tomlinson for taking pictures during the April meeting. Wish space wasn't so limited so I could show more of their photos.


