

The Sec'y/Treas. Message

[Instead of Ray's regular column this month he is passing on some interesting and important information he received from a law enforcement friend.] ed.

PERSONAL SECURITY

Law Enforcement investigators have recently disseminated what type of information is embedded in the credit card-type hotel room keys used throughout the hotel industry. Although the information differs from hotel to hotel, a key obtained from the "Doubletree" chain that was being used for a regional Identity Theft presentation was found to contain the following information:

Customer's (your) name
Customer's partial home address
Hotel room number
Check in and check out date
Customer's (your) credit card number and
Expiration date!

When you turn them in to the front desk, your personal information is there for any employee to access by simply scanning the card in the hotel scanner. An employee can take a handful of cards home and, using a scanning device, access the information onto a laptop computer and go shopping at your expense.

As a general rule, hotels do not erase these cards until an employee issues the card to the next hotel guest. The cards are usually kept in a drawer or box at the front desk with YOUR INFORMATION ON THEM!

The bottom line is - keep the cards or destroy them. Never leave them behind and never turn them in to the front desk when you check out of a room. Hotels have not been known to charge you for the cards.
