developed and implemented, which incidentally, is now being put into operation in Washoe County. What does this mean? He has salvaged on average 70% of the lives of the defendants (mostly drug related) who have appeared before him and have been fortunate to have been placed into his Alternative Sentencing Program. He currently saves Douglas County tax payers over 1.2 million dollars annually and has been primarily responsible for extending the life of the County jail facilities by a number of years. This also translates to tax dollars saved. Great job Jim; thanks a lot for your dedication and hard work.




