From the Secretary-Treasurer

I'm still waiting to hear from 10 members who have not paid their dues. September is the final month of our grace period; anyone from

whom I have not heard by September 30th will lose their membership in our chapter.

I am sorry to report that our dinner attendance in August was only 44. At the end of the Early Bird period (one week prior to the dinner), we only had reservations for 32!!!!! We are definitely on a downhill slide. For fiscal year 2007 (ending 6/30/07), we averaged 83.4 people for our 10 dinners that year. For fiscal year 2008 (ending 6/30/08), we averaged 62.3 people – a severe downturn in numbers. For the last fiscal year (ending

6/30/09), we averaged 56.7 people – continuing south. Some of this slide can be attributed to our decrease in members during the same periods. If anyone has a magic formula to reverse these trends, please contact an officer or board member. We'd love to hear it.

Our quarterly Service Recognition Award presentation, scheduled for the August dinner had to be postponed until September since our honoree was on military leave. It is anticipated that this presentation can be made at our September 17th dinner.

Our September 17th speaker is Frankye Craig, author of the books *Fateful Journey of Tamsen Donner*, the compelling story of the Donner Party brought to life, and

Daughters of Destiny. Her books about the Donner experience are far more than a morbid exploitation of the cannibalism that occurred while these unfortunate pioneer travelers were held hostage in the Sierra mountains. She writes of the people involved. She writes in a way that allows the reader to experience empathy for their plight, sharing in their victories and optimism as well as their defeats and hopelessness.

Frankye is a 12-year resident of Northern Nevada. After a career in interior design, she became a volunteer for the arts events. In 1996 she was asked by the California State Parks to organize the celebrations for the 150th anniversary of the Donner Party and the reunion of descendants of those who travelled west with the Donners. She has been a Donner Party buff, and now a historian, ever since. As a historian and author, she tries to allow her readers to get into the minds and personalities of the people who made this fateful journey across America in 1847, so that future generations will have a truer and better understanding of those tragic events in the Sierra.

I have recently finished reading her book *Fateful Journey* and found it to be most enjoyable. I look forward to her presentation and I look forward with equal enthusiasm to seeing all of you there. And, for those of you interested, I have asked Frankye to bring copies of her books so that our members may purchase a book directly from the author.


