The President's Message

Well, I told those of you who were at the last (November) meeting that I would expound on my latest adventure. I am relating the facts of this event because not many souls get to do what I just finished. I am speaking of my annual cattle drive.

When I say annual, I mean this was my 20th consecutive annual drive. Because a doctor with 30 drives and an investment banker with 25 didn't come this year, I became the "old man of the drive".

The drive, always in November, starts south of Bridgeport, Calif., and crossing highway 395 (with CHP help) heads north along the East Walker River, then over the Sweetwater Pass, and down into Smith Valley, Nevada. It ends at the Hunewill Guest Ranch at the far northwest corner of Smith Valley. Some 60 plus miles in distance, it takes five days to move the herd north. The cattle are moved for the simple reason that Bridgeport can experience up to eight feet of snow in the winter and would necessitate hay feeding if left there. Smith Valley, some 2000 feet lower, does not suffer the extreme weather the Bridgeport vicinity experiences.

This year the weather was mixed with it starting off cool on Monday and by Wednesday we were crossing the Sweetwater Pass in driving sleet and heavy wet blowing snow all day. I have experienced short sleeve shirt weather and freezing cold rain and snow through the years. It's Nevada; you never know what tomorrow's weather will bring. My wife, Denise has joined me on many of these drives, but this year she came on the last day, Friday, for the final 12 miles to the ranch.

We started with 617 cows, and only "misplaced" five along the 62 miles. They will be recovered as they turn up at various ranches along the way. Cows are very adept at hiding when they know you are looking for them.

There is always one adventure or another as the cows try to get into alfalfa fields and even people's yards along the way. We have developed a bovine specific vocabulary relating to these missteps. From experiencing a COW-TAS-TROPHY to UDDER CONFUSION, and experiencing annual DE-JA-MOO, we have to deal with cow mentality the whole way. It's like dealing with 617 badly behaved 5 to 6 year old little boys, all on a five day outing. When it's over I feel like I need to see aPSY-COW-ATRIST. Do I pay to experience this pain and suffering? Yes, I do. I pay good money to work hard, get cold and smelly, and be frustrated by horse and cow antics which would try any man's patience. Do I enjoy it? No, I love it and I will do it until I can't get up on my horse any longer.

Every man should build at least one house and also go on a cattle drive. I have done both, but I will never build another house. So...see you for the December Christmas Party at Ray's and I should be completely healed by then (both mentally and physically). If you are not able to attend, then have a wonderful, safe and happy holiday season and we'll be back together in mid January

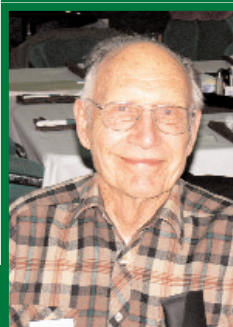

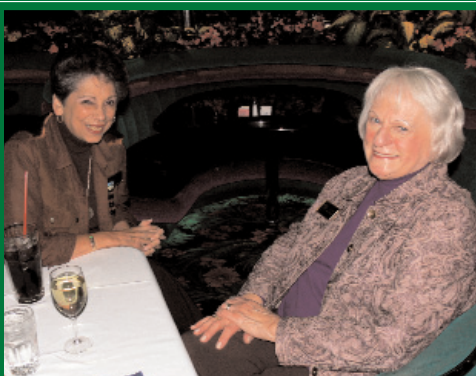
