The President's Message

Well, I will be absent from Command (police management talk!) for the March 15 meeting. I have been instructing for the California Specialized Training Institute (CSTI) in San Luis Obispo for the last few months on a one week a month schedule. For March,

the week falls on the Footprint regular meeting week. I have to teach for a week in Monterey Bay that week. I know it could have been a better location, like Bakersfield or Fresno, but what could I do about it? The school deals with disaster response and emergency preparedness training. I instruct the Earthquake and Sustained Operations portions of the courses. Unfortunately, California State government, in its infinite wisdom, has decided CSTI is not critically necessary in light of their budget crunch. I say unfortunately, because California will indeed experience serious earthquake or other disasters, via nature or man, and CSTI was the only facility preparing the next generation of responders.

The critical issue is; you can't wait for the disaster to do on the job

training. It happens too fast and too many crises are piling up which puts you well behind in prioritizing and dealing with those incidents if you are unprepared to act quickly from a point of practice and preparedness. CSTI prepared several hundred responders each year and without the experienced cadre to guide and teach them, they along with their city or county will be left to develop their expertise as they try to deal with another Northridge or Loma Prieta. Governments tend to be short sighted sometimes at the worst of times. Fortunately, Douglas County maintains a strong emergency preparedness posture with a regular planning and training schedule and designated personnel from the most probable responding agencies as regular participating members.

Keep safe and I will see you in April.


