The President's Message

Greetings....We had a pleasant visit from the IFA Grand President, Gene Mattson at our meeting. He and his bride, Maura Mattson, traveled from the Port Angeles, Washington area to join us. They said they had heard that our meetings were both well

attended and always interesting. Well, they got both at the meeting; lots of people and a great presentation on the IHOP incident from last September.

President Mattson gave me his prescription for building and maintaining a viable IFA organization and I thought I would pass along to you some of his thoughts which really apply to us here in the Carson Valley.

He recommends that each Chapter appoints a membership chairperson who makes a point of ensuring everyone works at building the organization. 
