### The President's Message

Dear Footprinters,

At our last meeting it was my intention to mention that we were just beginning National Police Week. It is especially meaningful to an organization such as ours that not only supports Law

Enforcement but has many current and former Law Enforcement officers within our club. For those that may not know the history......

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. Currently, tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, DC to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement. Decades later, the event, more commonly known as National Police Week, has grown to a series of events which attracts thousands of survivors and law enforcement officers to our Nation's Capital each year.

The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, DC honors federal, state and local law enforcers for their dedication and sacrifice. The memorial features

bronze sculptures depicting a series of adult lions protecting its cubs, symbolizing the protective role of law enforcement officers. Blue-gray marble walls are inscribed with the names of more than 17,500 officers who have been killed in the line of duty (dating back to 1792). Each May, during National Police Week new names of fallen officers are added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial. I was fortunate to be in Washington DC in May 2012 and observe part of this event and the beautiful tributes left by a grateful nation.

On a lighter note, our May meeting was well attended and I was able to perform one of my favorite duties as President, present a Service Recognition Award. This quarter it was presented to, recently retired, Fire Inspector John Babcock, of the East Fork Fire and Paramedic Districts. Congratulations John, enjoy a long and healthy retirement.





