From the Secretary-Treasurer

Happy Halloween to all of you.

I thought I'd shed some light on one of the origins of the "spooky" day/night.

Halloween had its beginnings in an ancient, pre-Christian Celtic festival of the dead. The Celtic peoples, who were

once found all over Europe, divided the year by four major holidays. According to their calendar, the year began on a day corresponding to November 1st on our present calendar. The date marked the beginning of winter. Since they were pastoral people, it was a time when cattle and sheep had to be moved to closer pastures and all livestock had to be secured for the winter months. Crops were harvested and stored. The date marked both an ending and a beginning in an eternal cycle.

Dressing up in costumes and going "guising" (trick or treating) was prevalent in Ireland and Scotland at Halloween by the late 19th century. Costuming became popular for Halloween parties in the US in the early 20th century, as often for adults as for children. The first mass-produced Halloween costumes appeared in stores in the 1930s when trick or treating was becoming popular in the United States.

Our speaker for November will be John Lambrose. He is a recently retired Federal Public Defender. Hope you will join us to welcome this new speaker.


