## From the Secretary-Treasurer

Throughout history peoples of all countries and kingdoms have honored their war dead by decorating their burial sites with flowers, flags, or laurel wreaths; paying homage to their ultimate sacrifice.

In the post-Civil War days, citizens from both sides of that conflict took time to honor the soldiers who fell in battle by decorating their graves with flowers and ribbons.

I recall, in our Country (USA), this day was named Decoration Day and was set aside as a day of remembrance. In 1967 the name was changed to Memorial Day. Each year in May, we take time to solemnly remember those who served in the Armed Forces of this Country those individuals who paid that ultimate price to serve not only their country, but also their comrades in arms.

Throughout the year, the memory of two shipmates comes to me when I see a picture or hear a phrase relating to the Vietnam War. Their names, Wayne Reinecke and Clayton Kemp are on the Vietnam Memorial Wall, right above each other; they both died at almost the same instant. The incident: There were five people on the helicopter as it went down aft of our carrier; two pilots, Reinecke, Kemp, and one passenger. The pilots survived with serious injuries. The passenger said that Kemp shoved him out of the chopper just as it was sinking. Neither Reinecke nor Kemp were ever recovered and the Tonkin Gulf is their final resting place. This might be considered one small incident to most during the Vietnam War. However, it was very big to me when I think of the sacrifices that both of these men made and, it brings me to tears.

I wish fair winds and flowing seas to both of my shipmates.

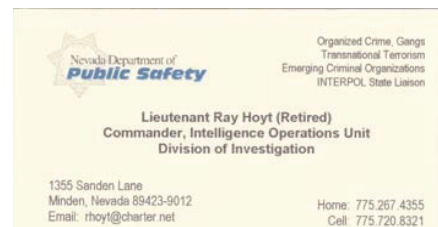
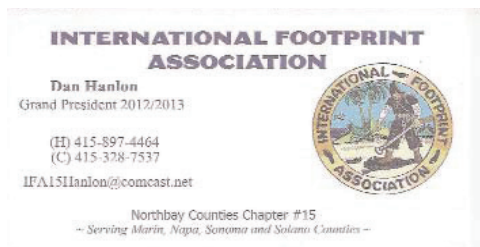
