Captain Dan Britton of the DCSO gave us a presentation regarding Fentanyl and the dangers associated with this deadly drug. The subject peaked everyone's interest and many questions were asked and answered. The bottom line is....if you see a white powder (in a plastic bag) DO NOT touch it. Call 911 and have the authorities deal with it. Captain Britton also discussed the benefits of Narcan, a life-saving medication that is used to reverse opioid overdose. At our March meeting, DCSO's Captain Dan Britton gave an excellent presentation on one extremely fatal drug, Fentanyl. In addition he talked about how Legislature "gutted" Nevada's laws surrounding penalties and sentences for drug related offenses. He stated that in the past, drug traffickers would not sell in Nevada because of our laws, but there is no fear anymore. Captain Britton was asked about new bills being presented to the Legislature. Here is his response:

There are currently 3 bills. The AG bill is SB35. The other 2 bills are republican bills and they are already DOA. The Governor's omnibus bill will be released soon and it will address both fentanyl and trafficking.

In addition, if you look at KOLO crime page, there's a story about the upcoming fentanyl legislation.

April's speaker will be Dominic Molyneau, Sr. Juvenile Probation Officer of the Douglas County Juvenile Department. Mr. Molyneau will tell us about their programs to support and assist with prevention and treatment of further delinquent behavior.

From the Grand Director/Membership Chairman

Recently, there have been some discussions about nonprofit organizations, tax exempt organizations, and related matters. There is apparently some confusion between the two; this article will attempt to clear up some common misconceptions.

Let's start with nonprofits. Most organizations like ours are incorporated with the Nevada Secretary of State's Office as a Nonprofit Corporation. In other states, the incorporation process is handled by that state's equivalent that is charged with managing corporations. The key here is that the process is wholly operated by state government, not the feds. Chapter 82 of the Nevada Revised Statutes sets forth the formation and regulation of nonprofit corporations.

Nevada has a State Business License program which applies to Nevada corporations. Chapter 76 of the Nevada Revised Statutes sets forth its provisions, one of which is that Nevada nonprofits who qualify as federal income tax exempt under Title 26, Section 501(c) of the United States Code – more on this later – are exempt from the State Business License. We qualify for such exemption.

Nevada nonprofit corporations must file an Annual List of Officers and Directors. Our annual list is due on June 30 each year. Included on the form are places to indicate our continuing qualification for the State Business License exemption.

Now for the Federal Income Tax Exemption. This is set forth in Title 26, Section 501(c) of the United States Code. This section has 29 subsections listing the types of organizations exempt from federal income taxes. The most popular of these subsections is 501(c)(3), which generally enumerates certain types of charities and foundations – not applicable to us. The IRS has determined that we fit in the 501(c)(10) category. Of the 29 subsections, very few provide that donations to those organizations will allow the donor to deduct such donations from their personal income taxes. Subsection 501(c)(10) is not one of them. Organizations which are exempt from federal income tax (like we are) must file an annual income tax form. We are among those who file what is known as an e-Postcard or Form 990-N. It is an online form with just a few questions that takes just a few minutes to complete and send. It is due November 15 each year.

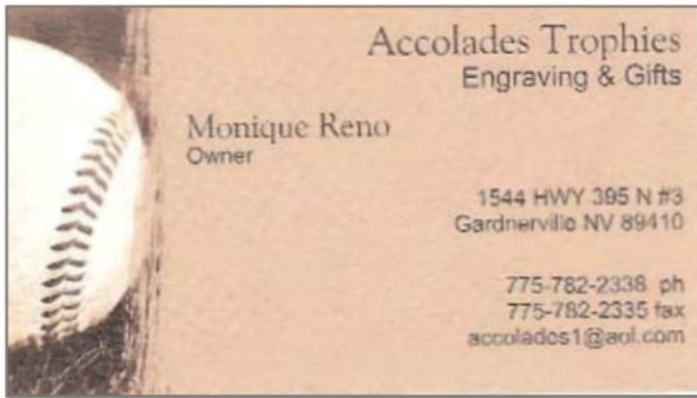
