Last month, I reported on our downhill slide in attendance at our monthly dinner meetings. I am sorry to report that the downward slide is continuing.

In September, we had another dismal turnout of 40. The count that qualified for the Early Bird drawing was only 28!!! The September attendance was likely impacted by AVID (Active Volunteers In Douglas) scheduling their annual picnic on the same day as our monthly meeting. Steps have been taken to ensure that such a conflict does not reoccur in the future.

It appears that we will lose 21 members due to non-renewal of their dues. The grace period expires on September 30th. This will take us to 131 regular members; on June 30, 2006, we were at our record high of 181. This loss of 50 members must be reversed if we are to stay a healthy and vibrant organization.

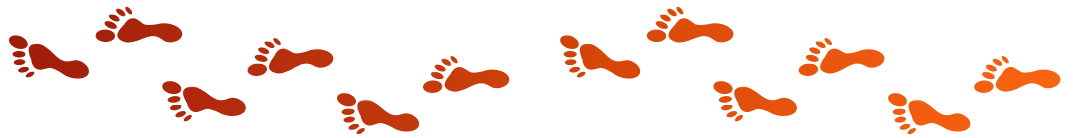
